


Overall Theme:

The mission of public art is to enrich and engage the community while enhancing spaces and contributing to economic vitality. The sculptures on this page depict Aerospace, Tech and Industrial uses found within Sub-Area #2.

General Location:

The public art will be located within key public spaces at the main entries of the development and will be representative of the intent of Port Colorado. The artwork should be located within public areas where pedestrian access is unrestricted and the pieces can be interactive with the community; in order to draw attention and pique interest.
